

City Council Meeting
Hebron Community Center
March 12th 2018, 7:00 p.m.

Members present at the meeting were; Mayor Grant Walth, Council members; Chester Brandt, Harvey Tibor, Steven Dittus, Michael Coots, Jim Staiger and Rebecca Heinle. Also present at the meeting; City Supervisor Jim Raaf, Building Inspector Joe Reinbold, Auditor Erin Brink, Deputy Auditor Roxane Walth, City Attorney Scott Solem. Visitors included Steve Maershbecker representing the Hebron Ambulance Squad, and Rocky Brown and Gerrard Wald of Wald Fencing and Supplies.

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm.

The February 12th regular council meeting minutes were reviewed and a motion was made to approve them. Brandt/Tibor MCU

February vouchers were reviewed and a motion was made to approve them. Dittus/Staiger MCU

There were no building permits for the month of February.

Delinquent water bills were discussed and door tags will be sent out.

The police report was reviewed.

There was no court report.

Visitor Steve Maershbecker presented the City with four signs to be placed at the entrances of the city stating the City is designated as a "Cardiac Ready Community". Maershbecker stated that on February 14th Hebron was given this distinction and joins only 20 other communities, half of which he stated have full time ambulance squads. The signs will be placed by the City of Hebron.

City Supervisor Raaf was present to discuss a quote the City received on a new loader and a used loader. He stated the cities current loader is in serious disrepair as it is a 79' model. Mayor Walth stated he would like to see more quotes and the equipment portfolio should be looking into this matter. Raaf requested that the 78 Scorpion Whip snowmobile be put out on bids. Raaf also stated that a man hole cover needs replacing and a curb stop will be repaired later in the month.

Rocky Brown and Gerrard Wald of Wald Fencing from Wishek were present to discuss the possibility of leasing or purchasing the large west portion of the Bolke Memorial Complex (cheese plant). The company currently has fencing inventory at the Farmers Elevator and once the property is sold would like to find a new property to possibly put a store that would supplies various items related to fencing. Brown stated that Hebron would be a hub for the south western part of the state. The building portfolio will be meeting Wednesday March 14th with Brown and Wald over at the Complex to do a walkthrough of the building to further look into the matter.

Council member Rebecca Heinle put in a letter of resignation for the Council as she is moving out of town. An ad will be placed in the Hebron Herald for anyone interested in being appointed to Council. A motion was made to accept the resignation letter. Staiger /Tibor MCU

The Auditor informed council that she had written a letter to a resident for numerous insufficient fund checks stating that the City will no longer accept checks as a form of payment. Council stated that if a check is returned for insufficient funds to turn over to the sheriff's department.

A motion was made to adjourn the regular Council meeting at 8:23 pm. Dittus/Heinle MCU.
